Identified barriers to Educational Achievement

Harewood Primary School has identified the following as barriers for some of the children currently in receipt of Pupil Premium:

- Parents and carers who find supporting their children's learning challenging
- Parents and carers who haven't established a positive relationship with professionals and are reluctant to engage
- Homes without books to stimulate and sustain an interest in reading
- Children with limited vocabulary
- Children who don't meet their developmental milestones
- Effects on wellbeing through living with limited income; poor home conditions, poor diet, inadequate clothing and lack of heating
- Poor health; illness impacting on school attendance
- Overcrowded living conditions with limited opportunity to study
- Social issues: children experiencing domestic violence, parents and carers with substance misuse, high number of children with regular social care involvement in their lives
- Emotional issues: high numbers of children with attachment disordered behaviour through being previously or currently in care. Children experiencing a number of short term carers impacts on their ability to form trusting relationships
- Mental health issues; parents, carers and children experiencing a range of mental health disorders
- Limited access to a broad range of experiences such as visits beyond the immediate vicinity, cultural visits to museums, galleries and concerts
- Opportunities to experience and participate in a range of sporting and musical events
